U.S. News and World Report recently published online their 2013 rankings to be included in the 2014 Edition of "America's Best Graduate Schools." The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill appears on multiple lists of schools, degree programs, and specialty areas.

Business, law, medicine, education, and engineering are the five disciplines *U.S. News* ranks annually. Periodically, rankings are provided for programs in science, social sciences and humanities, and health. Among this year's rankings are the UNC-CH <u>Department of Psychology</u>, tied for 12th, and the UNC-CH <u>Developmental Psychology Program</u>, tied for 5th. 
