This semester, participants will investigate the mechanisms underlying the impact of risk processes *in the context of protective mechanisms* on the developmental competencies of racial and ethnic minority youth. Speakers conducting research with African American, Latino, Asian American and Native American youth will present their research and participate in an ongoing discussion about the diverse pathways by which multiple levels of influence – including individual characteristics, personal experiences, social-contextual influences, the timing of events and experiences, and the developmental history of racial and ethnic minority youth – interact to impact adaptation and maladaptation.
