This award is given to a member of the Society for a Science of Clinical Psychology who has substantial experience mentoring clinical psychology graduate students, interns, and postdoctoral fellows in clinical psychological science.

The Cattell Award will fund Dr. Gordon's development of novel computational models and data-analytic methods that aim to increase understanding of individual differences in reading and to deepen the understanding of cognitive abilities that allow children to learn to read.
