Reznick Grant for Undergrads!



The J. Steven Reznick Diversity and Psychological Research Grant will support undergraduate students in the Spring 2019 semester. Two grants will be awarded to two undergraduate students and each student will receive \$2,000 to use to offset the need for part-time work, to cover the costs of carrying out research, or to attend a professional conference. One grant will be awarded to an undergraduate who is fairly advanced in psychological research and the second will be awarded to someone who is just starting out in psychological research.
